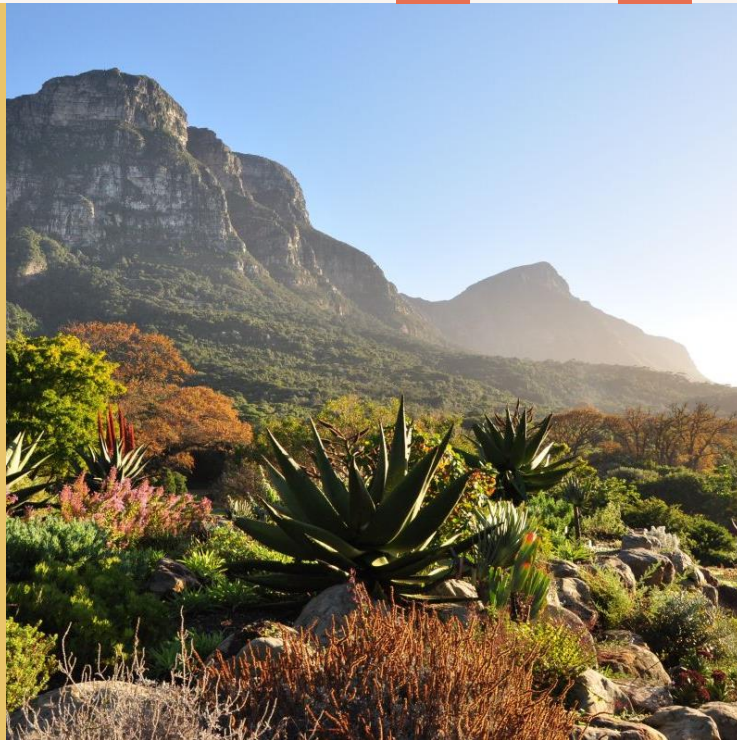

The Urgency of Change

What have we '**forgotten**,' and what can we **reimagine** through circular thinking and design? Imagine a world without waste. Imagine resources that **regenerate**, where technologies can be **well maintained, repaired, upgraded**, and a system where everything comes **full circle**.

There are enough innovative ways to use resources for thriving communities globally – **resources are finite**. By making different choices and redefining what a successful society looks like, we can solve problems that never existed in the past and prevent those we don't want in the future. A **circular approach** benefits all life and the planet.

South Africa Circular Economy Hotspot 2024 (SACEH24)

In **2024**, we hosted the first Circular Economy Hotspot Event in Cape Town. The conference featured a diverse array of speakers and exhibitors, highlighting key topics and sectors that **urgently need transformation**.

From resource scarcity and environmental degradation to pollution and social inequality, we explored **solutions** to shift from negative to positive impacts. Like many countries worldwide, South Africa faces a critical need to transition towards **sustainable business** and **industry practices**. The conference served as a platform to introduce, share, and exchange knowledge on the Circular Economy.

To further explore the opportunities of Circularity in Africa, we are **co-creating the 2nd South Africa Circular Summit**—not because we have reached the peak, but because that is where we aim to go, together.

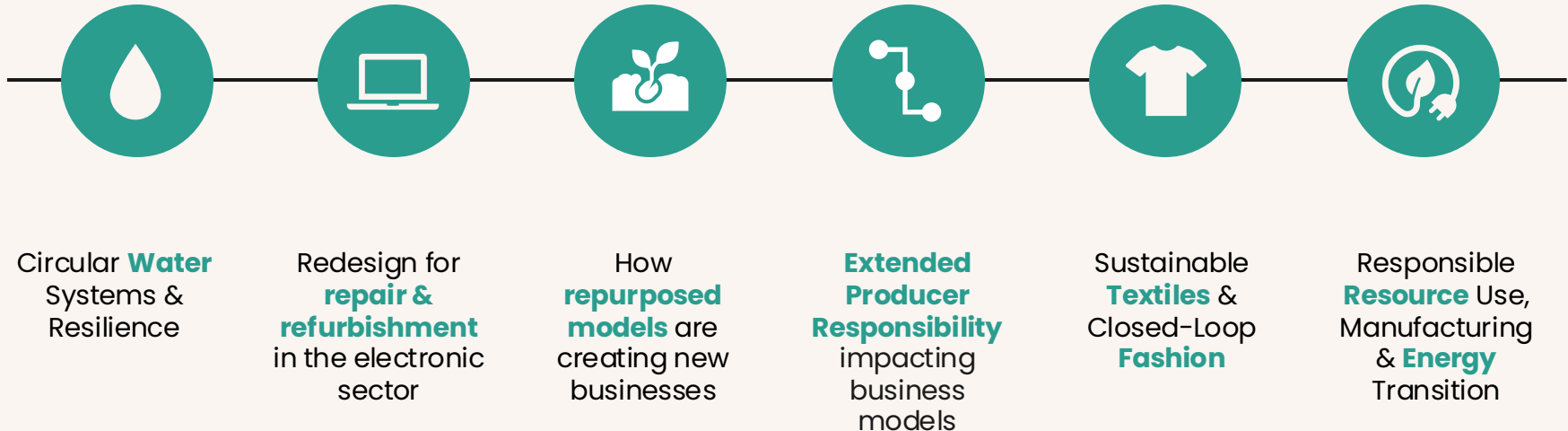
