Sub- Themes/ Work Packages:

- Examining historical narrative, Values, Worldview and Myths as idiosyncratic ways of deploying rhetorical devices.
- Examining the methods used by Violent extremist to navigate the practices of ordinary social life –Ethnomethodology Approach.
- The eco-system of VE Ideologies (and group support for them) within the human ecology of nested contexts and systems, including family, economic, social, and political structures.
- Mapping non-linear, and time-variant modelling of opinion formation during the following stages: 1) Pathway to Violent Extremism, 2) Being in Violent Extremism activities, 3) Disengaged with Violent Extremism.
- Value Network Analysis and Social Network Analysis to understand the complexity of internal and external value networks within the eco-system of VE Ideology.
- Violent extremism vs. nonviolent extremism: Internet as the dissemination of “extremist material” or for virtual venting that satisfies their desire to act –Symbolic interactionism.
- Life Histories: Capturing people’s experiences of living with violent extremism in communities/societies (Communities building resilience).
- Documenting the impact of current law enforcement and community policing practices on the trajectory of evolution of VE.
- Using game-theoretical approach and multi-agent modelling to create simulation of violent ideology, causing disruption.



Edinburgh Napier University Strengths:

- Mapping a non-linear and time-variant eco-system (s) of Violent Extremism (VE) to understand the complexity of internal and external value networks.
- Using game-theoretical approach to understand the individual preferences, behaviours and their interaction with the network in decentralised environment under information asymmetry.
- Producing generalized simulation-based model of the disruptive eco-system of extremism that can be used to understand, predict and mitigate the actions, decisions and behaviour of entities
