Our project idea

Youth Action Research for Democratic Competency

Across Europe there are a range of mainstream education institutions, organisations and charities that facilitate YPAR in different ways. This collaborative action research project aims to draw upon the expertise of a diverse range of countries and their YPAR pedagogies to produce interactive YPAR best-practice Guides for mainstream school teachers, informal educators, and preservice teacher educators. The Guides will be refined throughout a 3-year cross-cultural collaborative action research project that will use the Framework for Democratic Competences as its guiding principle, before being piloted in each country in the final year. The Guides will then be made freely available online with different languages available in order to promote democratic competences for 15–29-year-olds.

Research Objective

▶ To use cross-cultural collaborative action research to develop YPAR pedagogies that foster 15–29-year olds' democratic competences in formal and informal educational settings

- a Higher Education Institution where preservice teacher education takes place with preservice teachers aged 19-29;
- a community centre in an area of social disadvantage where informal education takes place with young people aged 15-24;
- a mainstream secondary school in an area of disadvantage with students aged 15-19;
- an organisation that has expertise in delivering YPAR;
- organisations that link to policy makers.
