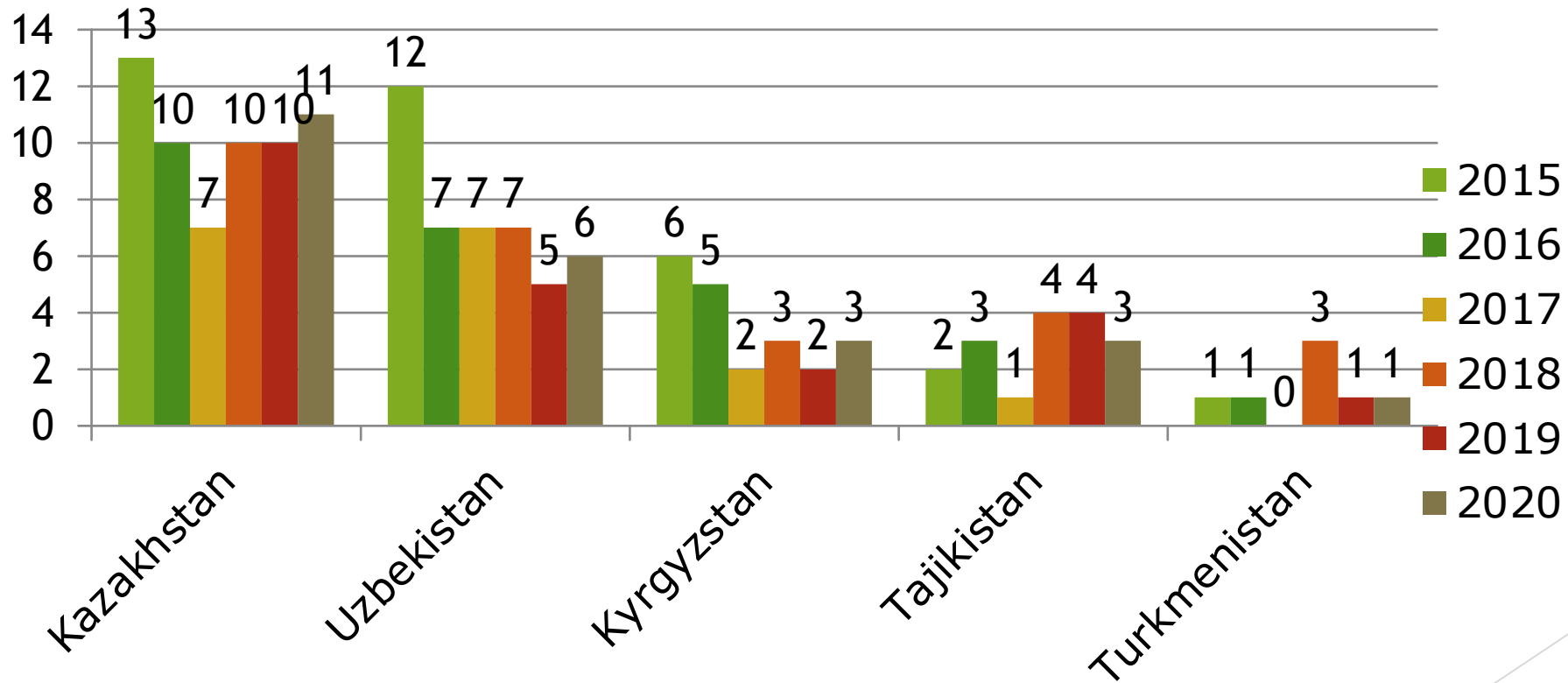

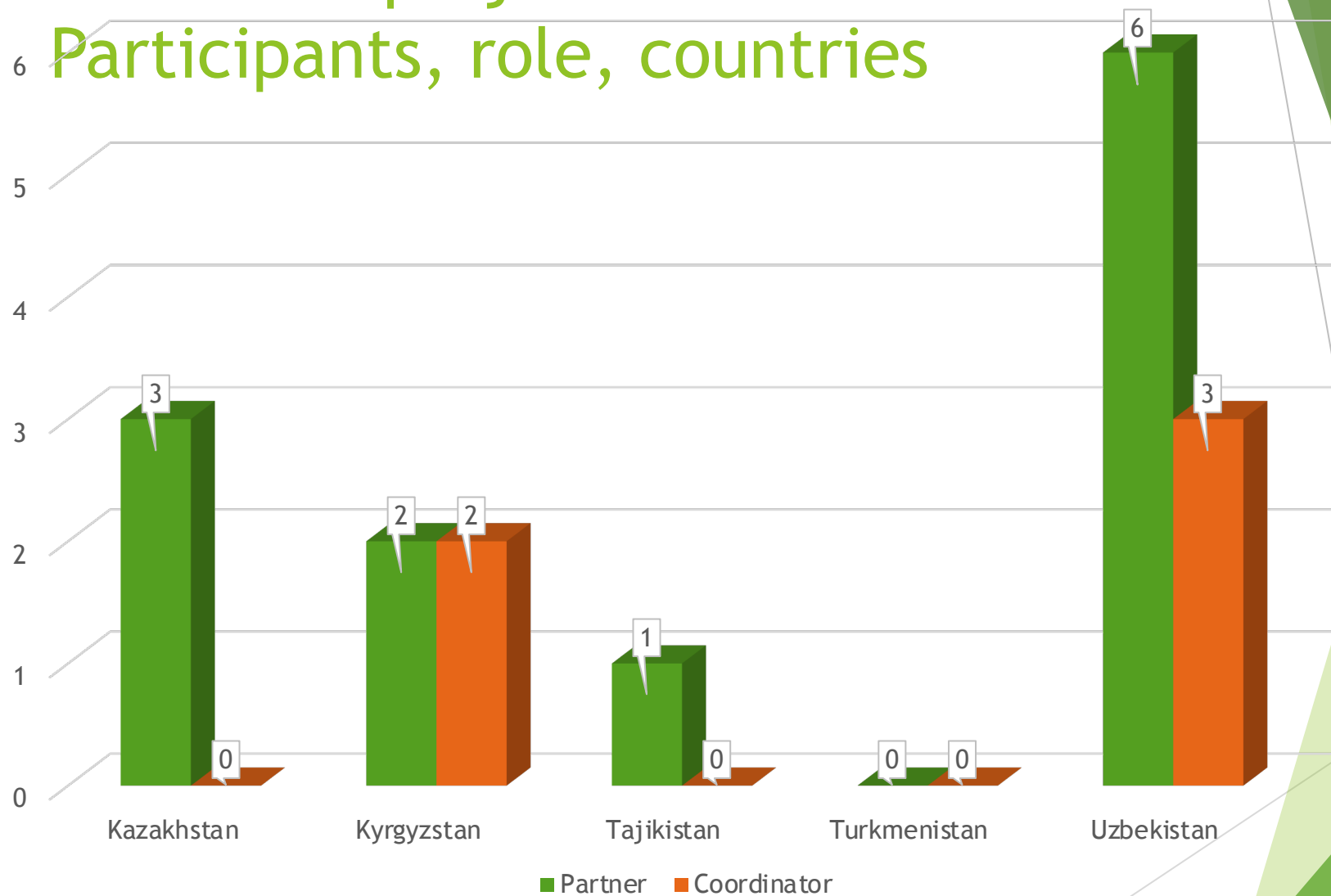

Participants per country (Legacy)

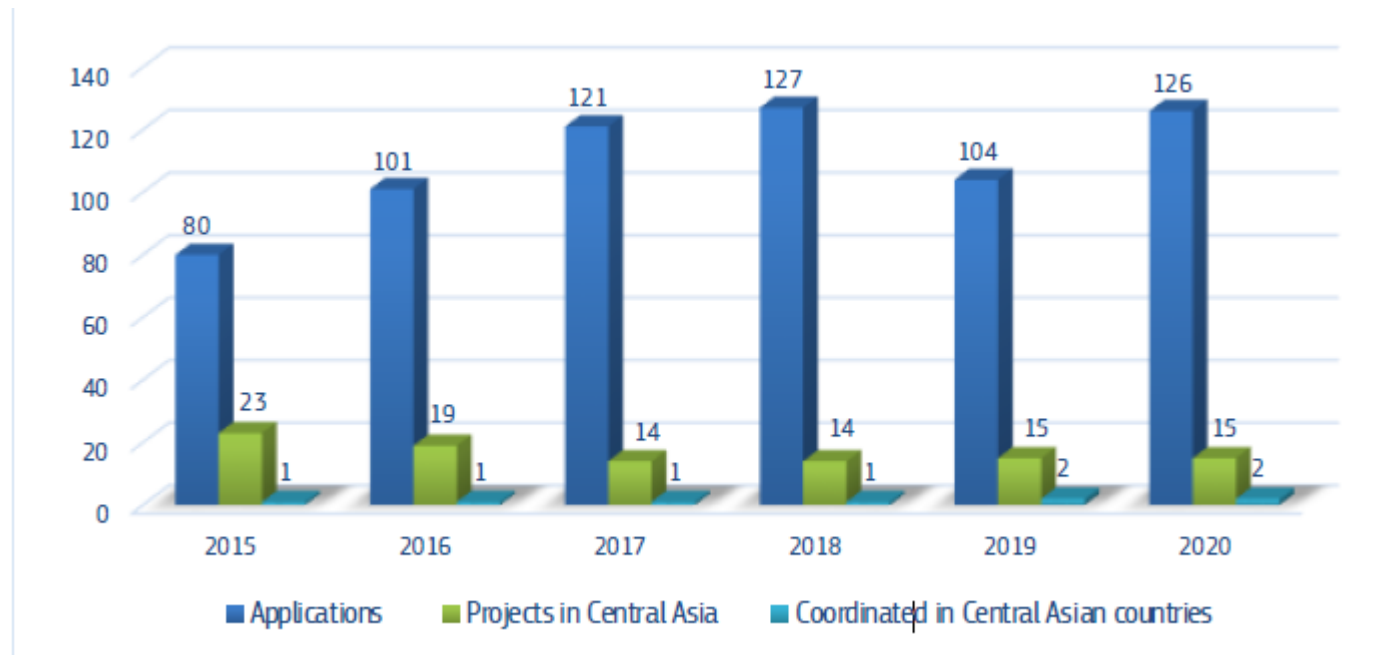


Selected projects in 2022

Some of the main past challenges

- ▶ **Lack of synergies** between different CBHE projects (and with other funded Erasmus+ initiatives) within the same institution
- ▶ **Insufficient involvement of decision-makers and national authorities** (especially for Structural Projects) in many projects
- ▶ **Lack of students involvement**
- ▶ **Sustainability of project results** often not sufficiently addressed by the consortia due to low project ownership by project partners
- ▶ **Further Involvement of non-academic partners**
- ▶ **Accreditation** can take a long time and does not allow the running of degree programmes within the eligibility period of the CBHE project
- ▶ **External difficulties:** E.g. Covid-19, political instability

Possible solutions

- ▶ Inform
- ▶ Involve
- ▶ Think ahead
