

2023: First Ministerial Meeting of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) on Higher Education

- The UfM is the intergovernmental organisation devoted to Euro-Mediterranean cooperation on different priority areas
- The UfM has **43 Member States**, including the 27 EU Member States, Türkiye and most Southern Mediterranean and Western Balkans countries
- The UfM has two co-Presidencies, one representing the north (held by the EU/represented by EEAS or Commission sectoral DGs) and one representing the south (currently held by Jordan)
- For the first time, UfM Ministers for higher education will gather on 8
 November in the city of Fes, Morocco to adopt a Ministerial Declaration outlining priority areas for future cooperation
