Search for funding

- Information on funding opportunities, policies, requirements and procedures
- Identify the right EU funding scheme for a project idea
- Understand an opportunity – expectations, what the funder is looking for?

Build a Consortium

- Identify partners that best serve a project's definition and goals
- Scouting of scientific and technological skills through **partner search tools and networking platforms**

Develop a proposal

- Support in proposal writing - guidance on the content and form of non-scientific proposal sections (eg Part B - impact, implementation sections)
- Proposal review
- Compliance review
- In case of coordination, support in managing interactions with the consortium, defining budget numbers, effort and content at WP or task level, managing proposal versioning, formatting and submitting the final proposal.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Design, implementation and validation of tools for measuring psychological variables in the field of health psychology and digital dependencies; - Design, implementation and evaluation of intervention in health promotion aimed to develop digital literacy in children and adolescents; - Evaluation of health interventions related to prevention strategies aimed at vulnerable groups and digital dependencies. - Human-Computer Interaction (HCI), novel interaction techniques and visualisations, gestural interaction, intelligent user interfaces, virtual and augmented reality, end-user development - Development of Mobile App, Gamification, 3D video games, VR, AR environments. - Gamification and VR Simulations applied to preventive strategies and health interventions designed for children, young adults, subjects with cognitive disabilities. - Applications that are configurable, adaptable and expandable in functionality by non-programmers. <p>Inner areas (such as a large part of Sardinia) are subject to a reduction in the provision of public services when, at the same time, the private market is not functioning.
